<p align="center">GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE COMPANY/INSTITUTION</p>	<p>The Basque Museum & Cultural Center (BMCC) was established in 1985 and is a 501 (c)(3) organization. It is directed by a diverse, volunteer, working Board of Directors and employs five full-time staff at the Museum and three fulltime staff at its immersion language preschool. The purpose of the Basque Museum & Cultural Center is to preserve, promote, and perpetuate awareness of Basque history and culture.</p> <p>As a museum, the collection of artifacts, photographs, archival materials, oral histories, music, dance and genealogical archival materials, etc. are of primary concern. Materials are shared through interpretive exhibits, lectures, presentations, and use of the library and archives by the public. Education is extremely important to the Board and staff of the Basque Museum & Cultural Center. The BMCC sponsors a Basque preschool, or Ikastola, and museum staff also works closely with staff and students from the BSU Basque Studies Program, and Departments of History and Modern Languages.</p> <p>The Museum’s outreach has expanded to interpretive panels on all buildings on the Basque Block, to the complete restoration and interpretation of the Cyrus Jacobs/Uberuaga House, to educational materials sent to all schools in the state over the past few years and to the creation of its own exhibits concerning various topics.</p>

<p>A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF MAIN PROJECTS</p>	<p>The BMCC mission is to preserve, promote, and perpetuate Basque history and culture. This is accomplished through the care and preservation of museum collections; promoting and educating the public on Basque culture and history with exhibits, events, and research resources; and perpetuating the history and culture through events, outreach, and our Basque immersion preschool (Boiseko Ikastola). The Global Training intern at the Basque Museum & Cultural Center will have the opportunity to assist in collection management, transcription and translation of letters, oral histories and web pages, and small exhibit curation. They will also be able to assist in other areas and departments of the Museum in order to gain a more well-rounded understanding of Museology from admissions and membership, educational tours and programs, curatorial expansion and organization, and more.</p>
<p>PREVIOUS COLLABORATION IN INTERNSHIP/TRAINING PROGRAMMES?</p>	<p>2016 – eight month internship with Eneko Tuduri through this Global Training Program. Eneko was tasked with collaborating with various Basque communities to create the Basque Music of the West virtual exhibit. Traveling to various communities, interviewing, collecting, researching and creating webpages on more than one hundred Basque musicians was included in some of his tasks. Eneko also created a small exhibit about Basque radio programs in the US, and assisted in education programs and tours.</p> <p>2018 – ten month internship of Aintzane Gonzalez through the Global Training Program. Aintzane has been translating various oral histories, archival documents, and summarizing oral history interviews as well as assisting the Basque Community History Team with research in various communities.</p>
