

COURSE: FOCUS ON MULTILINGUALISM: LANGUAGE INTEGRATION IN THE CURRICULUM

In collaboration with the Basque Government Department of Education

General aims of the course: The aim of the course is for participants to further develop their competencies as language and content teachers. The course uses a holistic approach adopting a multilingual focus that considers pupils as emergent multilinguals who can use their linguistic repertoire when learning and using languages. It aims at developing competencies to implement an integrated curriculum in primary and secondary school. The course combines theoretical perspectives with the application of some strategies to integrate languages and also languages and content in the classroom. The main language of the course is English so as to provide an opportunity to strengthen competencies in this language. The course is a UPV/EHU postgraduate course.

Participants: Primary and secondary school teachers of Basque, English, Spanish, French and other subjects. Staff from Berritzegune and Irale are also welcome. Comprehension skills in English are necessary to follow the lectures and readings.

Structure of the course: The course has three elements: an intensive module, an online module and a follow-up session. Registration should be made through the Basque Government Department of Education. The maximum number of participants in the course is 150.

1. INTENSIVE MODULE

Aim

To establish the theoretical basis for “Focus on multilingualism” and an integrated curriculum of languages. This module also aims at presenting different projects and research studies both from universities abroad and universities in the Basque Country. It will provide the opportunity to listen to the voices of some teachers who are in the process of implementing an integrated curriculum.

Language

The language of the intensive module is English but questions and comments can be in Basque or Spanish.
