

**Summary of the ToShare Observatory working line 1, 3, 4 and 5 meeting on "Derived requirements in terms of wealth sharing, compliance with Human Rights and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals", "Identification of the wealth generated by Industry 4.0 and new technologies", "Knowledge of wealth distribution" and "Search for progressive tax systems for a fair distribution of wealth".**

**Held on Tuesday, October 22, between 15:00 and 15:45 hours, in the Deanery (3rd floor) of the Faculty of Labor Relations and Social Work of the UPV/EHU and via skype.**

**Attendees: Noemi Peña (UPV/EHU), Luis Belaustegui (UPV/EHU), Rosario Goñi (Economists without borders), Manolo Bayona (Baladre Association) and Ángel Elías (UPV/EHU). Isa Álvarez (Baladre Association), Zuriñe Romeo (EDE Foundation), Xabier Zabala (ELA Sindikatua) and Sofía Marroquin (Oxfam-Intermon), together with other people who in the sent Doodle showed that they could not attend on this date.**

**In the meeting, before dealing with the items on the sent agenda, Ángel Elías explains the difficulties there have been, after receiving the answers in Doodle, to find a date and time, so in order to get a sufficient number of attendees, we have chosen to group topics 1, 3, 4 and 5.**

**Then, the topics established in the agenda are dealt with:**

**1) Information on the steps taken in the Observatory since the previous meetings held at the end of March 2019: contact with the 24 participating entities, keeping the website updated in Basque, Spanish and English, where many documents have been incorporated in the 6 lines of work, as well as disseminating various events. Four issues of the bulletin have also been published.**

**2) In the coming months, there are comments on continuing to share documents and publications, as well as generating a debate in social networks where, from each thematic group, initiatives are encouraged to be presented. It is agreed that the Observatory should reflect the contributions of the different people and entities, who are encouraged to take a more active role.**
