<u>Summary of work line 3 meeting of the ToShare Observatory on the</u> identification of the wealth generated by Industry 4.0 and new technologies

Held on Monday, March 25, between 11:00 and 13:00 am, at the Deanery (3rd floor) of the Faculty of Labour Relations and Social Work of the UPV/EHU.

In the meeting, according to the order of the day sent, the following topics are treated:

- 1) Information about the steps that been made in the Observatory: contact with entities of which already 23 participate, creation of 6 working groups that meet this week, 12 students who work as volunteers, the website that is currently in Basque and Spanish but soon it will also be in English, and preparation for its delivery in the next days of the newsletter. Likewise, the idea of creating a forum on the website, which allows it to be extended on social networks.
- 2) A presentation is made of what each one works in relation to this topic. The wealth of the group and the very complementary perspectives are verified coinciding in the need to sensitize and to form, as well as to encourage the realization of investigations like Degree Final Projects that deepen in this subject.
- 3) In possible contributions, several documents and publications are shared, and interesting topics are discussed to deepen the impact of technology on the transformation of the Basque industry, of what the industry will be like and what will be the role of the public sector as guarantor of a fair change that impacts the prosperity of the Basque Country and the welfare of its inhabitants. Likewise, on the model of labor relations and distribution of wealth in Industry 4.0, as well as on risks and opportunities and experiences in other countries.
- 4) As a coordination proposal, a summary of the meeting will be sent, permanent contact will be maintained by email and, when deemed convenient, also in person.
- 5) In other topics mention that there are a lot of resources that are dedicated to research on military issues, and that it is important that new technologies respond to common interests and be decided in democratic instances.
