Abstract

Abstracts must be written in English and the maximum length is ONE single-spaced page. Font type is Arial. The Title (14 pt bold) should be no more than two lines. Please provide the Affiliations (9 pt italic) in a concise manner. The name of the presenting author should appear first in the list of authors. The e-mail address of the presenting author is mandatory. Size of the font used in the abstract text is 10 pt, whereas the font size in figures, legends and references are 9 pt. References should be indicated by numbers in square brackets [1], [2], [3] etc. in the text and be given at the end of the abstract using 9 pt type. Use of this template is mandatory (with the same margins and two columns). The entire abstract (text, tables, and artworks) has to be submitted in just one file for expediting publication.

Keywords: no more than 4.

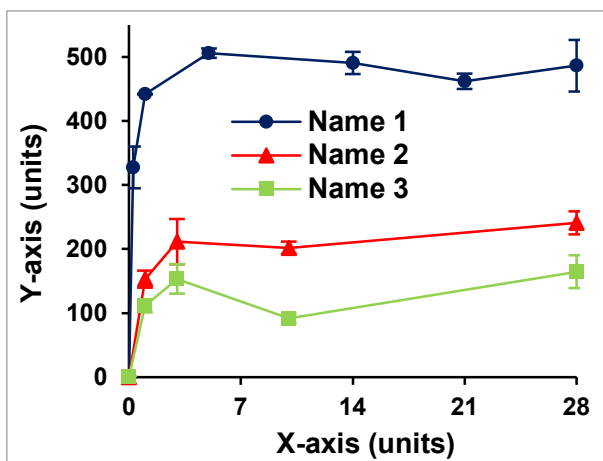


Fig 1. Figure title
